 D. Co-Ed Division one male or more

OPEN DISTRICT V CHEERLEADING CHAMPIONSHIP— The defined regular season will begin with the start of fall sports and conclude at the end of the winter sports championships.

VI. The top 3 scored cheerleading squads regardless of classification will advance to the PIAA Spirit Cheer Championship. The top scoring squad will be declared the District V CHAMPION and will receive 25 gold medals/trophy. The second highest scoring team will be declared runner up and will receive 25 silver medals. The 4th place team will serve as an alternate in the event a team is not able to compete at the state meet or an additional slot is offered to District 5.

VII. JUDGES DECISIONS ARE FINAL

- VIII. Winner's classifications (3) will be reported to the PIAA following the PIAA District 5 Championship.
- IX. **Pre-Practice -** A maximum of eight (8) minutes of pre-practice shall be scheduled for each squad, prior to the start of the competition.
- X. TICKET PRICES:

Championship: Students-\$3.00 Adults-\$6.00

Gate sale begin at 4:00PM—fans will not be permitted in the gym until after the last teams pre-practice. The gym doors will open at the conclusion of the last team's pre-practice session.

Complimentary Tickets - Each school will receive 6 complimentary tickets.

XI. Number of squads to advance to PIAA Championship (3)

The remaining teams will be selected in order to serve as an alternate in the event a team is not able to compete or the PIAA extends an invite for additional teams to compete at the state championship.

XII. **Times** - CHAMPIONSHIP will adhere to the following schedule, unless a time change is approved by the district chairman.

TEAM ARRIVAL TIME: 3:00PM

PRE - PRACTICE: 3:30PM - 4:30PM

CHAMPIONSHIP BEGINS: 5:00PM

- XIV. Cheer squads are responsible for their own safety (may use spotters) and must provide a labeled CD of music to be used. Only a coach or team designee may approach the sound area.
- XV. **Mascot Competition**: Must have a minimum of 2 mascot's entrees from participating cheerleading squads.

MASCOT JUDGING IS AS FOLLOWS:

a. Crowd appeal and interaction:b. Creativity:c. Dance:15 points10 points

d. Routine: Not to exceed 2 minutes and no more than 3 props.(optional)

XVI. Non-Competition Squads: The competition will allow for non-competition squads to perform an exhibition performance. These squads will not be judged and are not eligible to compete for the district 5 title. These squads will be admitted to the competition for free as long as they are participating as a team. Coaches of non-competition teams will also be admitted for free. Parents and spectators of these non-competition teams will be required to pay admission to the event. Youth and junior high squads will also be admitted for free as long as they sign up in advance and perform during the judging calculation portion of the championship.

WEB-SITE <u>DISTRICT5.PIAA.ORG</u>

1. Conditions of entry into a District tournament

Entry and participation in the PIAA District 5 Tournaments are voluntary. District 5 member schools are not required to enter into the tournaments sponsored by the District. Entry of a team into a tournament signifies that the member school accepts the conditions and provisions that are described here.

Further, a member school accepts the fact that the District 5 Committee reserves the right to make changes in the management, operation and schedule of the District 5 Tournaments if, in the committee's judgment, it becomes necessary.

2. No Protest Rule

Under PIAA there can be no protest of contests as follows:

The Board of Directors and District Committees will not consider any protests in contests, with officials' decisions involving interpretation or judgment.

In no case will the results of a contest be reversed nor will a contest be ordered or permitted to be replayed.

Questions regarding interpretation of rules or judgment of officials should be submitted, in writing, to the PIAA DISTRICT V CHAIRMEN

3. Officials

All officials for the District 5 tournaments are assigned by the District 5 Officials' Assignment Committee.

4. Photographing, Filming and Videotaping

PIAA rules and regulations do not prohibit schools, spectators, and/or media from photographing, filming or videotaping at District 5 tournaments.

5. Restriction of use of Tobacco Products

PIAA Board of Directors policy prohibits the use of tobacco products by participating and non-participating team personnel, including coaches, during any interscholastic athletic contest at any level of interscholastic athletic competition.

The use of tobacco products by team members/personnel and coaches is prohibited during pregame, game, and post-game activities in the locker rooms and in the vicinity of the gymnasium/field.

6. Any coach or player that is disqualified for unsportsmanlike conduct or flagrant misconduct is not permitted to participate in the awards program immediately following the game. This includes district championships and state championships.

DISQUALIFICATION FROM NEXT CONTEST

- A. Any coach ejected from an interscholastic athletic contest by a state high school association recognized registered official in that sport for unsportsmanlike conduct or flagrant misconduct shall be disqualified from coaching for the remainder of the day and in the next contest on the next play day at the same level.
- B. Any contestant ejected from an interscholastic athletic contest by a state high school association registered official in that sport for unsportsmanlike conduct or flagrant misconduct shall be disqualified from participating for the remainder of the day and in the next contest on the next play day at the same level.
- C. Refer to Article XII (by laws), Section 3A a school shall be required to forfeit a contest for using an ineligible coach
