I. PLAYOFF GAME ADMINISTRATION

- A. The Game Manager will be the liaison between the host site and the District 5 committee
- B. There will be seven officials assigned by the District committee and the host site will provide 4 chain crew personnel
- C. The host site will provide game workers (ticket sellers/collectors, announcer, scoreboard operator, ambulance service, security, etc.) to ensure the smooth operation of the contest. See District 5 Handbook for fees. Any increases in fees for workers must be approved by the District Chairman.
- D. The host site will control any concession stands and control all costs and receipts. The host site may also control any program sales they wish to make available.
- E. Bands and Halftime
The designated Home team band will perform the national anthem and the 15 minute halftime will be split among the two bands with the visiting band performing the first 7.5 minutes and the home band performing the last 7.5 minutes of halftime.
- F. The host site will control and assign press box accommodations for both teams press box personnel and the media in a fair and equitable manner.

II. PRE GAME WARMUPS

- A. The visiting team will have the choice of which end of the field they prefer to warm-up on

- B. Warm-up period prior to the game will be limited to 1 hour. No team is permitted onto the field more than 1 hour and fifteen minutes prior to scheduled kickoff and both teams must be off the field 15 minutes prior to the start time.
- C. The coin toss will be conducted by the officials 30 minutes prior to game time. A mock toss will be held at midfield just before kickoff.

III. TICKETS AND SCHOOL REIMBURSEMENT

- A. There will be 6 complimentary tickets provided for each school, for each round of the District 5 Football Playoffs.
- B. Cheerleaders in uniform and each school's marching band along with a reasonable number of chaperones/advisors will be admitted free.
- C. There will be no travel, meal, or pre-sale of tickets reimbursement for the District 5 Football Playoffs

IV. GAME BALLS: PIAA Approved

- A. Each school will be provided with a National Federation approved football for the playoffs by the District 5 committee for each playoff game.
- B. Each team must submit their game ball to the game officials upon request prior to each playoff game.

FOOTBALL RANKING AND PLAYOFF INFORMATION

- A. Points from first 9 games count for ranking.
- B. Ranking is determined by total points accumulated. Total points will be divided by total games played.
- C. Minimum of six schools advance into Class A districts.
- D. Additional qualifiers (up to 8 maximum) must have won at least 4 of their games, excluding scrimmages and tournament games.
- E. AA teams must qualify through District 6 rankings

2010-2011 P.I.A.A. DISTRICT V RANKING SYSTEM POINT SYSTEM – ALL DISTRICT V SPORTS

In order to have a District Champion named, there must be a minimum of three teams in that class.

1. A team receives 4 points for a win.
2. Bonus points are awarded on the following basis:

- 1 point awarded for a win over a class A school, total of 5 points
 - 2 points awarded for a win over a class AA school, total of 6 points
 - 3 points awarded for a win over a class AAA school, total of 7 points
 - 4 points awarded for a win over a class AAAA school, total of 8 points
3. No points are awarded for a loss regardless of opponent's classification.

Victories over out of state opponents or non-P.I.A.A. opponents will receive the lowest point total awarded in that classification for a victory.

4. Tournament games, scrimmages, and exhibition games (example: alumni games) do not count in ranking.

5. Forfeiture of a contest will be governed by P.I.A.A. rules.

6. Rankings are based on all school schedules that are turned into the District V Statistician by the first legal starting date for that sports season. If games are lost by a school because a scheduled opponent disbands their team before the first legal play date, they may schedule other games for ranking. If games are lost by a school because a scheduled opponent disbands their team after the first legal play date, they may receive forfeits for the games lost.

TIE BREAKER SYSTEM FOR RANKING ONLY, APPLIED IN ORDER

(Tournament games will not be used in any of the criteria listed below.)

A. Head to Head victor, if the teams played each other

B. Winning percentage versus all common opponents in all games played (regardless of the number of times two schools play each other).

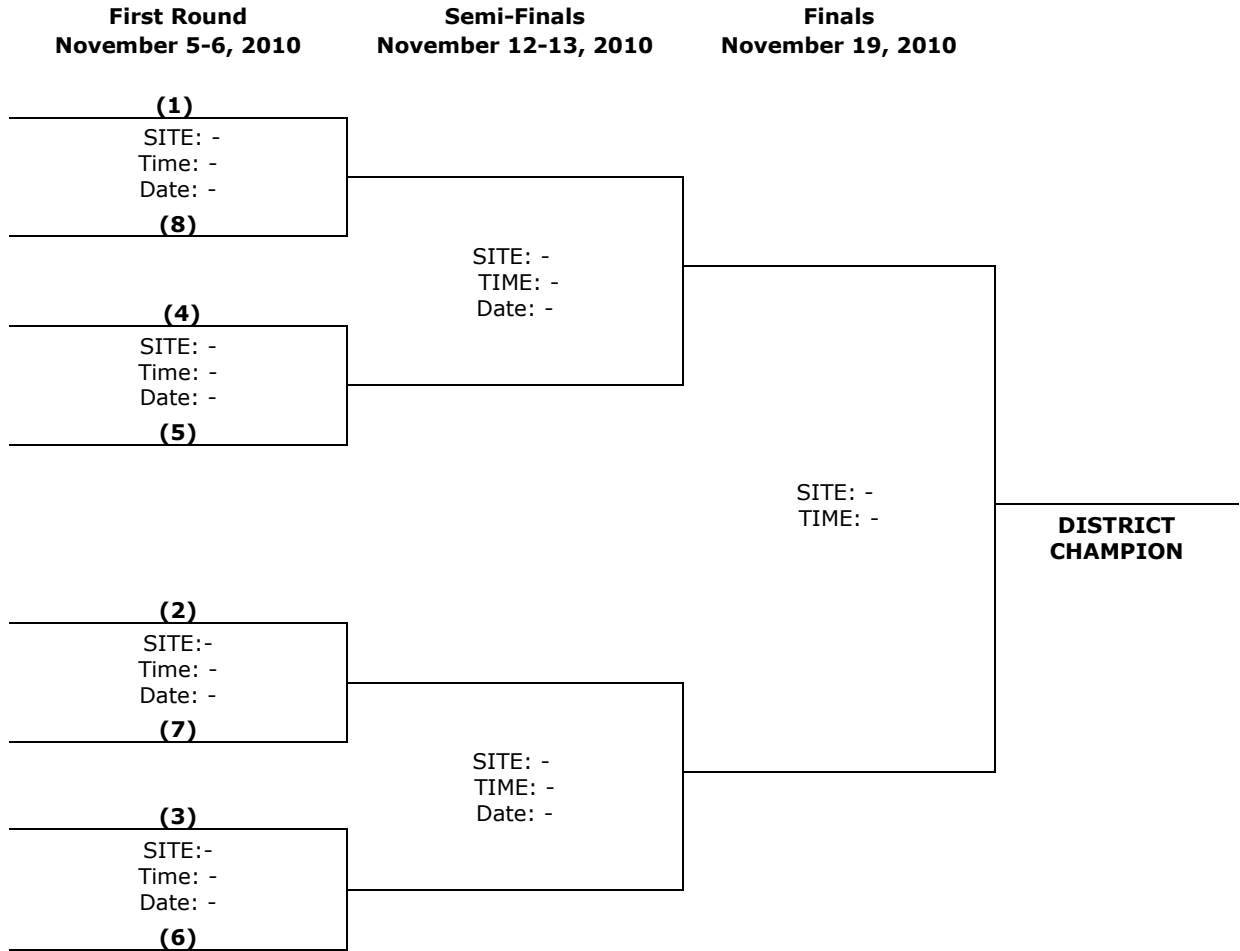
C. Bonus Points as calculated by wins by defeated opponents divided by games played.

D. Winning percentage calculated by wins divided by games played. Ties count as half.

E. Greatest number of wins, excluding tournaments & exhibition games (example: Alumni Games)

F. Coin toss at site convenient to both schools
